Description

This print represents a story from the Book of Daniel in which King Belshazzar holds a feast and drinks from vessels that had been looted in the destruction of the First Temple. During the feast, a human hand appears and writes illegible words on the wall. The King calls upon Daniel to interpret this scene. Daniel tells the king that as

punishment for his deed, God has numbered his days. Soon, his kingdom will be given to the Medes and the Persians. Dali depicts God in the center of the image. In the lower right, a melted clock similar to those in the artist's famous work, *The Persistence of Memory*, appears. The clock suggests the limited time that remains for the king and his kingdom.

This piece framed measures 30" wide x 35.50" tall.
